

Lord Mayor officially opens new Cork counselling centre

CORK Counselling at the Hazelton Clinic has celebrated its official opening.

Located at the Ardfallen Medical Centre, Douglas Road, the centre was officially opened by the Lord Mayor of Cork, Cllr Dara Murphy, last Thursday.

Cork Counselling at the Hazelton Clinic opened its doors to patients in November 2008, as the first dedicated counselling centre in Ireland.

The Lord Mayor thanked the clinic's owners for innovative thinking in hard times of recession and for recognising the need for dedicated counselling services in Cork city.

The centre boasts a five-star, sound-proof premises, where confidential counselling services are provided by a highly qualified team of counsellors, available to everyone.

Richard Dore of Cork Counselling stressed that the centre offers a wide range of counselling services, covering such areas as phobias, anxiety, relationship and marital problems, bereavement, personal development.

The need for these services is reflected in the rapidly increasing number of GP referrals that the clinic has been receiving since it opened.

The Lord Mayor said that, as the head of the task force dealing with addictions, he was delighted that Cork Counselling provided a service that is not only available within 24 hours from first contact, but that is also non-judgmental, holistic and fully confidential.

Cork Counselling aims to educate and promote awareness of the various issues that most people find themselves struggling with. Courses such as The Family Programme, Men's
